The program takes place in cooperation with the Greater Boston Food Bank, Haverhill residents, and organizations, including the Lions Club, Haverhill Council on Aging, and Haverhill Housing. Volunteers pack and distribute the "brown bags" with groceries each month. The bags are given out to income-eligible adults age 60 and older.

Free help on Medicare/Medicaid ambulance billing
